THE PLAYFAIR Built in the mid-nineteenth century The Playfair building was designed by William Henry Playfair in the manner of an Elizabethan Palace. It was widely reported as one of Scotland's great landmarks and is said to have been admired by Queen Victoria. Its great quadrangular form creates an attractive internal courtyard whilst the external elevations are punctuated by a central clock tower and domed turrets which dominate Edinburgh's skyline.



A NEW ERA

The long history of Donaldson's began in 1830, when James Donaldson bequeathed his estate to build an orphanage for boys and girls.

Since then, a lot has changed - from its long occupation as a school for the deaf to wartime Zeppelin damage. But, through the years, Donaldson's palatial exterior has thankfully remained intact.

The Playfair and gatehouses are now being respectfully restored and converted by the dedicated heritage specialist, City & Country.






